## **Car Seats:**

### **Missouri's Child Restraint Law (RSMo 307.182)**

- Children less than 4 years old or less than 40 pounds must be in an appropriate child safety seat.
- Children ages 4 through 7 who weigh at least 40 pounds must be in an appropriate child safety seat or booster seat unless they are 80 pounds or 4'9" tall.
- Children 8 and over or weighing at least 80 pounds or at least 4'9" tall are required to be secured by a safety belt or buckled into an appropriate booster seat.

*\*Energy Crisis Intervention Program: assists qualified individuals and families by providing limited payments to have electricity and/or gas bills paid and services restored, up to \$800 in winter (October-May) and up to \$300 in summer. Non-Discriminatory Services offered to the public:

**Community Protection:** Surveillance and follow-up of all communicable diseases

**Tuberculosis Program:** Offering TB skin testing, follow-up, and referral of individuals with positive tests

**Environmental Services:** Inspection of day care facilities, schools, restaurants, caterers, taverns, temporary food stands, grocery stores, truck wrecks, lodging facilities, and private water supplies. Investigate environmental complaints and violations of wastewater and sewage. Issue permits and perform inspections on new or updated onsite wastewater systems. Assist with communicable disease control involving food or water-borne illnesses. Provide education for food handlers and day care providers.

**Maternal Child Health (MCH):** Offers services to ensure the health and well being of Cole County citizens with special emphasis women of childbearing age, teens and children. Women of childbearing age are encouraged to enter prenatal care by their 13<sup>th</sup> week of pregnancy. Teens and adults are educated in the early recognition and prevention of teen suicide. They are the Missouri Care Health Plan (Mo Care), HealthCare USA (HCUSA), and Mercy Care Plus. CCHD can not see clients with any MC+ plan other than Mo Care. Missouri Care is contracted with the Obstetricians of OB-GYN & Associates in Jefferson City with delivery at Capital Region Medical Center (CRMC) in Jefferson City. Health Care USA is contracted with the Obstetricians of Women's Clinic in Jefferson City for delivery at St. Mary's Health Center (SMHC) in Jefferson City. There are no contracted Obstetricians in Jefferson City for Mercy Care Plus. Cole County Health Dept. does not accept private insurance that covers charges for prenatal care.
